### **3RD BATTERY "B," PENNSYLVANIA VOLUNTEERS**

This company of distinguished men and women has been organized in Civil War re-enactment for 20 years. They hail from Boalsburg, Pennsylvania, home of the first Memorial Day celebration. This company travels annually to The Greenbrier to participate in our July 4th festivities. They invite guests to visit their small camp, which includes cannons (reproductions), on the North Lawn on Friday, July 4th. During the evening concert, Battery B will fire the cannons during several musical selections and fireworks.

### **CHARLESTON METROPOLITAN BAND**

The Charleston Metropolitan Band is an all-volunteer organization sponsored by the City of Charleston, West Virginia and the Appalachian Musicians Union #136. The band was organized in 1992 and dedicated to providing community service through the marching and concert bands. The extensive repertoire of the concert band includes classical transcriptions, Broadway musical favorites, original compositions for band, patriotic selections and current popular melodies. The band is under the direction of Mr. Al Frey.
